I've used Evernote for all of my notetaking and script writing for over 10 years and I have hundreds of notes, scripts, book ideas, contacts, saved receipts, and recipes in dozens of folders. Importing them to Notion took a few minutes. After a few weeks I'm still learning some of the ins and outs of Notion but I've found it to be the tool I'll end up using.

The free version of Notion is plenty for most people but teams might want to upgrade to a premium subscription for \$120 a year. A personal premium subscription is \$47.99 a year which is about \$70 less than the similar plan on Evernote.

I've been trying both Notion, Microsoft OneNote, Apple Notes, and Google Keep and found Notion is the most similar to Evernote so if you're looking for something different, free, and powerful, it's worth considering.
